



F16 replacement



- BSDI/AWG TOR (Terms Of Reference)
- Aim of BSDI/AWG
- to elaborate an industrial participation business plan (IPBP) that is based on the return of activities that can be expected by the Belgian industry at the occasion of the procurement of the successor of the Belgian F16 aircraft by the Belgian Defence. The IPBP will list the companies identified, and the type of products/service/technologies which are under consideration. Work shares do not belong to this IPBP.
- to promote, in collaboration with the Belgian Defence, the succession of the F-16 towards the public authorities on the basis of the established IPBP.
- at the occasion of the contractual phase as well as in the follow-on support phases, to assure the industrial participation (return) as foreseen in coordination with the public authorities.
